You Shall Call His Name Jesus

Mary's heart must have felt as though it was beating out of her chest when the angel Gabriel pronounced, the Lord is with you, and you are about to conceive and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus! (Luke 1:31) Joseph may have experienced something similar when an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream saying the same thing.

This would have unraveled me. The enormity of what was about to happen a teenage girl could not begin to understand, let alone the man who was to become Jesus' earthly father. Even in hindsight, I'm not sure I grasp it very well.

You shall call his name Jesus.

In the ancient world, fathers had ultimate naming rights. And in this moment God the Father, through the angel says, *call Him Jesus* - the Son of God, the Savior of mankind, God incarnate is coming to earth. Jesus, a name that means Jehovah is salvation.

When Rachel, the patriarch Jacob's wife, was giving birth, with her dying breath she named her second son Ben-oni, *son of my sorrow*. Jacob, however, said no. He would not re-live his grief and sadness every time he saw the boy. So he said, *we will call him Benjamin, son of my right hand*.

Maybe there are moments in your life, as there are in mine, where sorrow, suffering, trials, regret, distress, trouble, or disappointment seem overwhelming, and we have a choice. What will we call our experience? Not what do I see, but what am I going to say about what I see? Jacob, who loved Rachel so much he worked without pay for fourteen years, deeply mourned the loss of his favorite wife. Yet he chose to define this moment differently. I am going to call my son, Benjamin, the son of my right hand. The hand used to impart blessing; the hand of authority, power, and strength; the hand Isaac

used to bless him years earlier. It did not change the reality of what happened or bring his wife back, but <u>Jacob saw his situation differently</u> and chose to speak forth a blessing in the middle of his pain.

What do we say when our heart is shattered, the prognosis isn't good, and all human reason for hope is gone? Will we choose to name what we see in faith and trust the greatest Name changer of all?

Our Father has the ultimate naming rights in our life, and His Word tells us we are a child of God (Romans 8:16), redeemed from the hand of the enemy (Psalm 107:2), forgiven (Colossians 1:13,14), justified (Romans 5:11), a new creature (2 Corinthians 5:17), led by the Spirit of God (Romans 8:14), a son of God (Romans 8:14), more than a conqueror (Romans 8:37), being transformed by the renewing of my mind (Romans 12:1,2), an imitator of Jesus (Ephesians 5:1), an overcomer by the blood of the Lamb and the word of our testimony (Revelation 12:11), and the light of the world (Matthew 5:14). This is how Our Father names us, and I chose to agree with Him. There is something about that Name.
